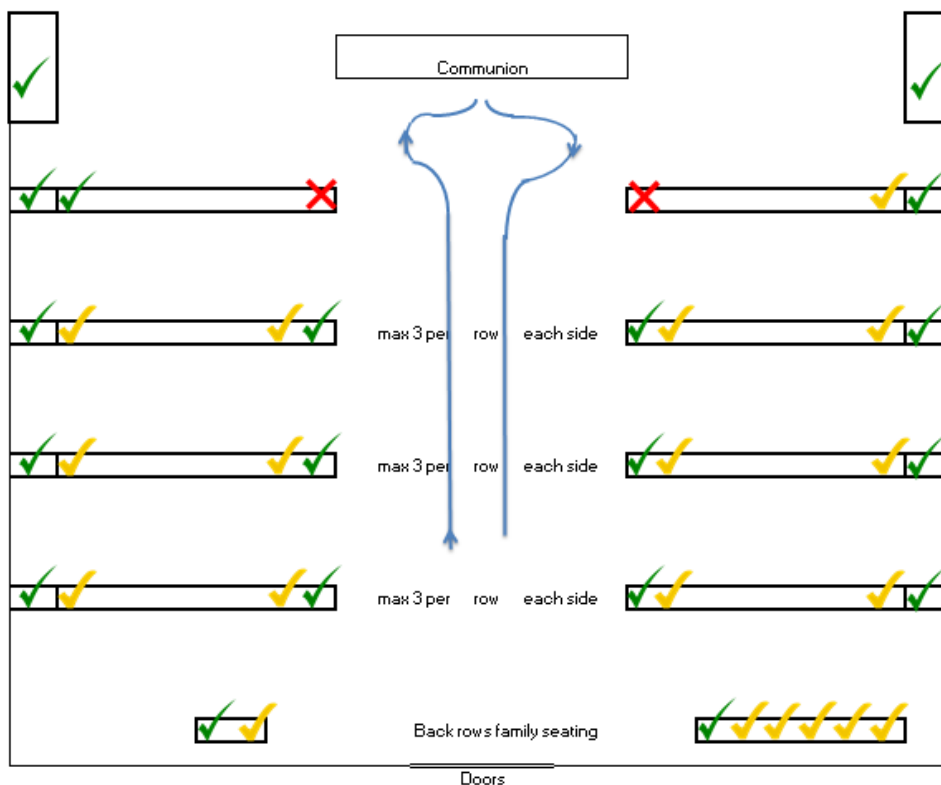

Traffic Pattern for the Reception of Communion

Please wear your face covering removing it only as you reach Father to receive Communion
You are welcome to wear gloves but they must be removed when you receive communion as Father will place the consecrated host in your hand.

Sat. 6/12 Memorial of Saint Anthony of Padua

Yes this is the Saint you pray to find things. The story goes that while he was teaching a novice decided to leave the community and took St Anthony's Psalter with him. After St Anthony prayed the novice returned to the Franciscans and brought his book back. Another tradition is St Anthony's Bread. The easiest origin explanation to remember is of a store keeper who after a great deal of trouble with the lock to her store promised bread for the poor if she could be simply let in. The same locksmith who had previously failed took out a key and it opened the door.

This though is not the cool stuff. Spend some time seeing how much St Anthony packed into his 36 year lifespan. Learn of the places he visited the things he did and the things that happened to him, and you will then better understand why he is a Doctor of the Church.

"The creator of the heavens obeys a carpenter; the God of eternal glory listens to a poor virgin. Has anyone ever witnessed anything comparable to this? Let the philosopher no longer disdain from listening to the common laborer; the wise, to the simple; the educated, to the illiterate; a child of a prince, to a peasant." (St Anthony of Padua)
