Wed. 2/13 One of The Saints of This Day is Saint Agabus

He is mentioned in Acts 11 & 21. Known as a prophet he predicted both a famine in the year 45 AD and Paul's captivity. He was one of those martyred in Antioch.

Thurs. 2/14 Memorial of Saints Cyril and Methodius

These two were brothers. When Cyril was in what is now Turkey, he was given a missionary charge, to the area between and above the Caspian and the Black Sea, which was a success. Two years later he was given the challenge that made he and his brother famous. They were sent to deepen the faith of Slavic Catholics, in the Eastern Church, who lived in the area now known as Southern Poland and parts of the Czech Republic. (Politics even then.) They succeeded by developing an alphabet that lead to studies for the people in their native language something the Roman Catholics evangelizing there had resisted. It has evolved into Cyrillic, which is still used by many languages today.
