He lost his mother when very young and was at times not well himself. When his sister died, he entered the Passionists. Given that one of his most famous quotes was "Our perfection does not consist of doing extraordinary things but to do the ordinary well." Like Therese of Lisieux, he died of TB at a young age. Another famous quote of his is, "I will attempt day by day to break my will into pieces. I want to do God's Holy Will, not my own."

Thurs 2/28 Blessed Daniel Brottier

He was ordained and sent to Senegal as a missionary. He returned home ill but raised funds to build a Cathedral in Senegal. When WWI broke out, he volunteered as a Chaplain & spent four years at the front without a wound. After the war, he established an orphanage in Paris,
