Mon. 5/6 Feast of St Dominic Savio: Saint of the day and patron saint of juvenile delinquents.

He came under the care and direction of St John Bosco when he was only 12. Early on he declared that he wanted to become a priest. He also wanted to people to get along and get things done. He formed the Company of the Immaculate Conception a group dedicated to prayer and work. When the time came, this group later became some of the first Salesians. Unfortunately at the age of 14, he “fell asleep” before that day came. After some serious discussion and just short of 100 years, Pope Pius XII made the decision in 1954 that you could not be too young (or old or anything else) to be declared a saint. *“I can’t do big things. But I want all I do, even the smallest thing, to be for the greater glory of God.”* Dominic Savio

Fri. 5/8 Saint Peter of Tarentaise

Are you ready there are actually two Saint Peter of Tarentaise. This is the one that was originally a monk, who was called up to replace a corrupt bishop. He did his job well, replacing and correcting clergy and visiting with the people. He was known for serving bread & soup to the poor, starting the “May Bread.” (This was stopped at the time of The Revolution.) Then he disappeared, to an abbey in Switzerland. He was convince to return to his role as a bishop and came back to care for the poor. He died years later returning from a Papal Diplomatic assignment.
