

Additional Thoughts from of Saint Teresa of Calcutta:



Mon. 5/20 Saint Bernardine of Siena

As a young man he cared for the sick during the plague and also for a family member and then prayed to know God's will for him. He became a Franciscan and walked from town to town preaching tirelessly to the point of being compared by the Pope to St Paul. The symbol shown here cause controversy but was designed by St Bernardine to be remembered by his audiences in place of other non-Catholic symbology of his day. It was loosely based on Greek Letters in Jesus' name. He used it in preaching about the Holy Name of Jesus, the Paschal Mystery, the Passion of the Cross and the Resurrection.

Wed. 5/22 Saints of this day: Saint Rita of Cascia

Forced to marry she outlived her husband and children and then pursued a religious life. She did become a nun and was known for her prayer and charity as well as the care for the sick and counsel she provided to those in need. Known for praying, "There is nothing impossible to God." She is a patron saint of lost causes.


