Mon. 6/10 Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church

This Memorial is new. Pope Francis formally recognized this celebration and placed it into the Church’s Calendar last year. *“The birth of the Head is also the birth of the body, thus indicating that Mary is at once Mother of Christ, the Son of God, and mother of the members of his Mystical Body, which is the Church.”* (Leo the Great) From the Cross, Jesus made her our mother also.

Tue. 6/11 Memorial of Saint Barnabas

It is easy to forget St Barnabas “The son of encouragement” was the one who physically brought Paul to the Apostles and was with him as they first preached to the Gentiles in Antioch. Working with Mark, Barnabas became the Patron Saint of Cyprus. Ultimately, Paul and Barnabas were friends in Christ and both are thought of as if they were Apostles.

Thurs. 6/13 Memorial of Saint Anthony of Padua

Fernando from Lisbon became an Augustinian at 15, studied theology and became a priest. Things changed when the remains of five martyrs were brought to his monastery from Morocco. Inspired, he got permission to leave the Augustinians and become Anthony a Franciscan. He then set out for Morocco, but God’s plan was different. His gifts were applied to teaching at a friary and preaching with the people of Northern Italy. He was so good that a speech he gave in Rome was described as follows: “The response was so great that people later said that it seemed the miracle of Pentecost was repeated. “
