The Alabama Tax Man Cometh - However You Do Have Some Control.

If you register, you can redirect some portion of you tax payment directly to a school or schools on the approved SGO list (like C2, St Barnabas School or Cristo Rey) as a dollar for dollar tax credit. Remember what ever portion you redirect effectively becomes unavailable for other government activities. You can go to myalabamataxes.alabama.gov to register. A listing of SGOs can be found by searching Alabama Revenue Alabama Accountability Act and then scrolling down to Participating Non Public Schools. Wed.10/2 Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels

This memorial has been observed since Pope Paul V added it to the calendar in 1615. The basis-in addition to the Magisterium of the Church, per Jesus’ words “See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father.” Mt. 18:10. Per FransiscanMedia.org, their purpose is “to represent individuals before God, to watch over them always, to aid their prayer, and to present their souls to God at death.

Also known for his simple following of Christ’s word and receiving stigmata, St Francis is said to have famously stated “Where there is charity and wisdom, there is neither fear nor ignorance.”
